- ◆ **Walter Mouton** is a legendary Cajun musician whose reputation rests primarily on his live performances at Cajun dances. His band recorded "The Scott Playboys Special" as a single in 1970, and his music is heard on the sound track to the film J'ai été au bal, but he is best known for his Saturday night performances at Breaux Bridge's La Poussière Club. He started playing there some 35 years ago, beginning his weekly gig in the mid-1980s. Mouton put together the first version of the Scott Playboys in 1952 when he was 13. Walter will be teaching advanced accordion workshops.
- ◆ **Jason Frey** is a reknowned, multi-talented musician from Eunice, Louisiana. His expertise on the fiddle matches his proficiency on the accordion. He brings outstanding skills of adding flourishes and personalizing traditional tunes to both his fiddle workshops and the evening dance parties. You don't want to miss his wonderful ornamentation, lively humor and gentle demeanor! Jason will teach the advanced fiddle workshops.
- ◆ **Charlie Terr** and **John Terr** have contributed fabulous musicianship and charm to our Cajun Weekends since the beginning. They are both founders of the renowned Chicago Cajun Aces band and continue to teach, play and inspire audiences and students across the country. Charlie will lead the intermediate accordion workshops and John will lead the guitar workshop.
- ◆ **Eric Mohring** is a versatile, nationally recognized Cajun fiddler who plays with the New Riverside Ramblers, winner of the Prix Dehors de Nous from the Cajun French Music Association for the best Cajun band outside the state of Louisiana. Eric has been a fiddle instructor at Augusta Cajun Week and played for many years with the nationally-known Bone Tones. He will lead the intermediate fiddle classes.
- ◆ **Maureen Mullen**, a talented, dynamic dance instructor and musician is back! She has taught Cajun dance locally and nationally for over 20 years and we are thrilled she is back to break down the subtle nuances of Cajun dancing in her supportive and fun teaching style.
- ◆ **Jackie & Larry Miller**, natives of Iota, LA, are the epitome of Cajun hospitality. As a child, Jackie learned cooking from all the grandmas she could adopt. She has authored two Cajun cookbooks and is a regular instructor at the Augusta Heritage Center. She will broaden our culinary horizons during her cooking classes! Larry, a renowned Cajun accordion builder, devotes his time to preserving Cajun culture and will be on hand to play during jam sessions and share his knowledge during a culture session.
- ◆ **Brian O'Donnell** plays Cajun fiddle for Madison's own, The Cajun Strangers. Their latest cd was awarded the 2010 Prix DeHors de Nous from the Cajun French Music Association, a great honor the band has received twice. Brian has traveled many times to LA and has studied with Courtney Granger and Kevin Wimmer. He will be teaching beginning fiddle.
- ◆ **Gene Losey** will guide very beginning accordion players in basic scales, fingering and the techniques that "make it sound Cajun" in a supportive, encouraging setting. Don't have an accordion? We can find one for you to use during the class! (Inquire early, limited availability.)
